Heart & Soul serves an average of 45 guests for breakfast and 160 guests for lunch daily. The food pantry assists over 700 persons monthly with supplemental groceries. In 2012, the dining room served 49,599 meals. During the same year, the pantry provided groceries for 100,451 meals to 7,727 people.

Located at the intersection of Census Tracts 202 and 205, the following are the rates of poverty from the 2010 Census. As you can see, Heart & Soul assists the needlest population in Niagara Falls.

# Immerse Participants Build Community through 'Mission in the City'

What would it be like if you had no shoes or socks to wear? No food to eat? If you had to attend a school filled with dirt, debris and dark and dreary walls? What if you were a senior citizen and had no one to talk to each day? Those attending Immerse—the 2012 national gathering of American Baptist youth in



Washington, D.C.—addressed these issues and more as they immersed themselves in scripture, prayer, worship and service.

For two days during the recent gathering, American Baptist Home Mission Societies (ABHMS) deployed more than 1,000 youth to build communities of hope in the metro D.C. area in

an initiative dubbed "Mission in the City." Participants completed a wide range of projects, including gleaning fields of collard greens—picking the stalks bare; collecting enough corn on the cob to fill a tractor-trailer—more than 18,000 pounds; delivering bags of groceries to homebound seniors in the morning and engaging others in an afternoon of fun and games at a Caribbean festival; cleaning traps in the Anacostia River; and washing individuals' feet and presenting them with new footwear.

Chase Bradford of First Baptist Church, Terre Haute, Ind., was deeply affected by the foot washing. "The most transformational for me was to pray with a young girl after I washed her feet and presented her with a new pair of shoes and socks," he says.

#### Hospice Chaplains: A Ministry of Presence and Hope

Bob and Helen courageously faced Bob's dementia together, but when their lives became too much to manage, Helen knew that they needed to make a change. They moved to a smaller home near their son, but Bob's condition wors-



ened to the point where he wasn't always able to recognize Helen as his wife. Helen realized that they needed the kind of support that hospice provides.

The Rev. Sue Callahan-Camaiore brought her theological understanding and active listening skills into the home to help dispel Helen's growing sense of isolation. An American Baptist-endorsed hospice chaplain from Michigan, Callahan-Camaiore works for Seasons Hospice and Palliative Care, a community-based organization operating in several states across the country.

Hospice chaplains encourage people like Bob and Helen to explore ways in which their faith in God gives them strength in end-of-life situations. "It is walking with another person during the most difficult time of their life as they lose the person they love," Callahan-Camaiore observes.

Hospice chaplains prepare for their work with seminary training, as well as hundreds of hours of clinical pastoral education.


