

Wednesday evening services in Lent will be led by Rev. Kathleen Ordiway. Not to be left in the dust, our kitchen crew, the Donna and Sally duo with lots of help from whoever volunteers either Wednesday afternoons before the service to prep and on Thursday to help with Lenten Luncheons with short messages from a variety of pastors on aspects of Lent. This writer thinks of Lent as a time of service and self-improvement as well as penitence before Easter.

If you'd like to help on the luncheons the Wednesday afternoon before the service or Thursday to set up, clean or work in the dining room, see Donna to pick a day. 

During the month of February, we will collect for Blankets and Cleanup Kits for CWS, Christian World Service, which is active throughout the United States and abroad. Given the weather, fire and flood problems across this country, blankets and clean up kits are needed in many places including Puerto Rico. Children and families with children from there are coming to the US at a large rate weekly. The teachers have left the island for the US and many schools need to be rebuilt. Contributions are needed for relief and a small dollar can be used for the purposes given.

The Gift of Music will present on February 11th, second Sunday at 2:00 PM, "Air 'Peritif', a wood wind trio with Marsh Jones, Anita Harless, and Susan Smith. There will be a reception following the concert.



Announcement of Royal Appointments

The Royal Society for the Arts announces the election of The Rev. William Thomas and The Rev. Cheryl-Wood Thomas as Fellows of the RSA (FRSA).

William Thomas is recognized for his housing initiatives, adult education, social services, environmental concerns, gender justice, care for migrant workers and religious services in the Canadian cities of Sydney and Halifax, Nova Scotia, in St. John, New Brunswick, and in St. Catharines, Ontario. He has been recently engaged to develop and expand an Outreach Ministry in Fort Erie, Ontario, to serve the currently "unchurched" downtown and other parts of the municipality, including youth and seniors, those with special needs, First Nations, immigrants and others seeking to share in the quest for sustainable community and meaningful life.

Cheryl Wood-Thomas is recognized as a leader in current refugee initiatives, including the sponsorship, welcoming and smooth integration into Canadian life of 38 Syrian refugees. During her brief 2015-16 tenure at St. John's Stevensville United Church in Fort Erie there were 32 arrivals, including two torture victims. The next year she welcomed 6 more privately – cases in which government and UN files had become disordered in the chaotic year of Canada's special initiative with Syrian refugees. Rev. Cheryl's support for arts and letters in both church and community is also acknowledged in her appointment as a fellow of the Royal Society for the Arts.

Founded by Benjamin Franklin, Adam Smith and others in 1754, the "Royal Society for Encouragement of Arts, Manufactures and Commerce," was later joined by author Charles Dickens and theorist Karl Marx. The royal patron of the RSA is HRH Queen Elizabeth II. Uniquely among royal societies, presiding president HRH Princess Anne supports the society's mandate to provide an intellectual foundation for stable and progressive community life. RSA fellows throughout the British Commonwealth and the USA endeavour to achieve this goal.

The best known Canadian fellow over the years was the then young human rights lawyer, John G. Diefenbaker, FRSA. Nelson Mandela, FRSA, was a particularly distinguished fellow of late. British fellows recently elected include activist and physicist Stephen Hawking and Dame Judi Dench, activist and actress.

The Wood-Thomas duo is the first married couple elected to this prestigious fellowship in its 264-year history. In both church and community, they complement each other in the promotion of societal enrichment.

While also a respected preacher, Rev. Bill is especially known for his outstanding leadership as a community organizer in the cities mentioned above, and beyond. Likewise, while Cheryl's own outreach ministry is well recognized, she is primarily known as one of Canada's most distinguished preachers, "both popular and profound," serving currently in the pulpit of First Grantham United Church in St. Catharines, Ontario, Canada.



Ministry Notes

At First Baptist Church we are all still delighted and celebrating the Ordination of "The Rev. Kathleen Ordiway." She and I are often referred to as Co- Pastors because we share a parking space, an office and preaching duties, but Kath is the one you see in the pulpit most often.

Along with some contributions as Scholar-in-Residence, like a book, a play, or the editing of someone else's work in the congregation, I do preach about a dozen times per year. My next gig here is a series of sermons this spring, right through Lent. But to hold up my end of the preaching, I bring some of Canada's better-known preachers to share the load throughout the year ... it makes us truly an "international congregation."

You have had sermons from Canadians like Alan Minarcik and Ward Kaiser, as well as fairly regular appearances by my cousin, Cathy Chambers. The Rev. Cheryl Wood-Thomas and The Rev. Bill Thomas have also preached here once or twice and will again this year. Those two have just received recognition of note in their election as "Fellows" of the Royal Society for the Arts. The press release is included in this issue of the Tower Topics because I wanted you to share our delight, and to know what excellent support Kath and I have in the pulpit.


