

It's Friday September 8, 2017 and I'm at the Atlanta International airport waiting to board my flight to the Dominican Republic. As you have all heard, Hurricane Irma passed just north of Haiti and the Dominican Republic. I am heading back to La Romana where I lived for 12 years to offer support in whatever way they might need...medical, emotional, spiritual...but I know this about my brothers and sisters on that island...they are strong! I am going to work alongside them and join with them in whatever plans they already have in place. Please keep me and all of them in your prayers as another storm, Hurricane Jose, is already a category 3 and headed in their general direction. If there are needs for teams, either to rebuild or with medical work, I will let you know as those needs are given to me. Right now, there are a couple of ways that you can help with relief efforts. First, One Great Hour of Sharing is a fund that provides support to partners of the American Baptists and other denominations when tragedies like this occur. You can donate through your church and specify, "Hurricanes 2017" or "Hurricane Irma" if you would like to make a gift to that fund. [October will be our One Great Hour of Sharing Mission for the month.] Another option is to make a gift to the Health Care Project fund that supports my work around the world so I can attend to immediate needs just like this one.

Finally, you can support one of the many missionaries working in the countries affected by the hurricanes. Each of us need your financial and prayer support to stay on the field and continue to work with our brothers and sisters in the affected areas. Consider becoming a monthly donor today!


# October 2017 is the 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the REFORMATION

## \$10,000 in One Great Hour of Sharing Funding Released for Hurricane Harvey Relief

**VALLEY FORGE, PA (ABNS 8/31/17)**—In response to Hurricane Harvey's devastation along the Gulf Coast in Texas and Louisiana, American Baptist Home Mission Societies (ABHMS) has released \$10,000 in One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) Emergency Disaster Relief funds to Church World Service on behalf of American Baptist Churches USA. More funds will be released as damage assessments are gathered in the coming weeks.

Making landfall on Aug. 25, Hurricane Harvey brought with it 130 mph winds and an unprecedented amount of torrential rainfall in some areas, resulting in flooding, power outages, downed trees and signs, major property damage, displaced residents, injuries and at least 38 fatalities.

American Baptists are urged to pray for and donate to those affected.



## **Hunger: Facts and Faces**

#### **Walking for Food**

- Over 852 million people around the world are hungry one-seventh of the human family.
- Most of these people are not victims of famine, but suffer from chronic hunger and malnutrition that stunts growth, sapping energy and potential.
- Every day, more than 16,000 children die from hunger-related causes
   about one child every five seconds.
- 1.2 billion people in developing countries live on an income of \$1 a day or less.

What is poverty? To come home and see your children go hungry and not have anything to give them.

#### **Walking for Water**

- 1 of every 6 people in the world lacks access to safe drinking water.
- 1 of every 3 people lacks access to improved sanitation.
- In sub-Saharan Africa, just 57% of the people enjoy access to safe water.
- In the 1990s, the number of children killed by diarrhea the result of unsafe water and sanitation — exceeded the number of people killed in armed conflicts since World War II.
