The Book Nook


This Church Library is the recipient of three new books this month. It's interesting that the New Revised Standard Version (NRSV) of the Bible is the one most mainline Protestant churches use (it is our pew Bible version), but in recent years it has been harder to find, as other more "pop" versions have sprung up - many with a particular The Cokesbury Publishing theological slant. House is reversing that unfortunate trend and has begun to offer several editions of the NRSV. We have purchased three: The New Oxford Annotated Bible (with The Apocrypha); the New Interpreter's Study Bible (with The Apocrypha); and a beautiful large print edition of the NRSV. The Interpreter's Study Bible goes along with the two sets (original and latest) that we have and is published by the Abingdon Press. Oxford University Press has published the New Oxford Annotated Bible.

These are all wonderful reference works as well as authoritative ecumenical works. By using accessible language they combine scholarly accuracy and insight with attention to questions that people have in their reading and devotion.





My Baptist Life: Jabulani McCalister



Rev. Jabulani McCalister is the Senior Pastor at Calvary Baptist Church in Providence, R.I. He oversees the spiritual well-being and growth of a 300-member congregation.

I began my faith journey my junior year in college at the University of Michigan-Ann Arbor. My early church experience was not positive. Fortunately I met some friends in college who showed me a better experience. It was their Christ-like examples that led me to Christ and coming to church.

I'm an American Baptist because the ABC family has been a big part of my spiritual growth and development by helping me to discern and allowing me to use my spiritual gifts as the Holy Spirit reveals them. I was a member of Greater Christ Baptist Church in Detroit, Mich., under the leadership of Rev. Dr. James C. Perkins for 16 years. He was the one who introduced me to ABC life.

The greatest challenge facing the church today is I believe we have lost the true sense of our purpose – to bring people to Jesus Christ so He can save their souls. We have become social clubs more interested in "growing "our churches instead of growing disciples of Jesus Christ.

I pray a great deal about people getting to know Jesus and how their hearts and lives can be transformed through living for Him.

I often struggle with looking at all the suffering and meanness caused by spiritual warfare, which I basically define as the fight between followers of Jesus and evil forces (i.e. the devil and demons of

life). Paul describes/introduces this battle and how to combat it in Ephesians 6: 10-20 and 2 Corinthians 10: 1-6. Sometimes it seems that love has been depleted from the world because we have chosen death instead of life. I struggle because I wonder how the Lord can let this happen until I realize we all have a choice to make. It's hard for me to understand why people would choose a life without God.

I am most passionate about training up children, youth and young adults to serve the Lord. These groups, especially young adults, have so much to offer but are often ignored by the church.

In 10 years, I am concerned the church will become irrelevant in the world's eyes, even more so than now, unless we have ministry that is relevant to reach people outside of our church walls. We have an answer for those people, but if no one knows about it and lives are not transformed, what's the point? On the other hand, Jesus said the gates of hell will not prevail against the church He built. So there will always be "the church" because it is not just an organization or building but a living, breathing organism. In other words: the church is the Body of Christ, which will never die (Matthew 16: 18).

Paul Rollet of Chatham, Illinois, Appointed to Missionary Service in the Philippines



The Rev. Dr. Paul Rollet of Chatham, Illinois, has been appointed as an associate missionary by American Baptist International Ministries (IM). In association with Mission Ministries, Inc., Rollet is serving in the Philippines with Companion with the Poor (CWTP), a church planting organization and community working to launch holistic churches that meet the spiritual needs of the poorest of the poor living in metro Manila.

Through this ministry, Rollet aims to help strengthen and grow the capacity of CWTP to send missionaries to North and South America and other parts of the world. Rollet's ministry of training Filipino believers to themselves be missionaries expresses IM's commitment to mission from everywhere to everyone. His home church is Cherry Hills Baptist Church in Springfield, Illinois.

Rollet's appointment with IM began in June 2016. "However," he notes, "I actually served with Companion with the Poor for two years in 2012 and 2013 while working on my doctorate through Bakke Graduate University. After returning to the United States in 2014, I felt called to return to the Philippines and work again with Companion with the Poor. My desire is to see holistic transformation in urban poor communities around the world and to invite more people to join the work.

<u>The Rev. Sharon T. Koh, Installed as</u> <u>Executive Director Elect of International Ministries, Launches I am IM Gift Match</u>

In a historic celebration before a gathering of hundreds of mission supporters, the Rev. Sharon T. Koh of Los Angeles, California, was installed as executive director elect of American Baptist International Ministries (IM). She began her service as executive director elect on July 1, 2016, and will assume the role of executive director on September 1, 2016, following the retirement of the Rev. Dr. Reid S. Trulson on August 31.

The ceremony of installation on Friday, July 8, was the culmination of the four-day biennial World Mission Conference at the Green Lake Conference Center in Wisconsin. With more than 400 mission supporters in attendance, Koh was enthusiastically and warmly welcomed into her new role. The ceremony ended with a moving laying on of hands that included members of the IM board of directors, IM leadership, American Baptist Churches USA (ABCUSA) leadership and the entire assembly.

"It was a sacred moment," stated Koh. "I had a sense of both God's presence and God's promise through the hands and prayers of those surrounding me."

Family and friends were elated. In attendance were Koh's parents, Rev. Dr. Victor and Kah-Kiat Koh, longtime missionaries; her mentor, Cheryl Brown, and her husband, Wes, who have both served as IM missionaries; and Brown's daughter, Julie Brown Ono, who is a friend and previous colleague. Sterling and Emi Miller, missionaries in whose commissioning Koh participated, now serving in Japan with Asian Access/SIM, also joined the celebration.

Pastors and leaders of ABCUSA celebrated this new and exciting chapter in the life of IM. "The entire ABCUSA family rejoices at the appointment of Sharon Koh and welcomes her as executive director of IM and as a national secretary of ABCUSA," said Dr. Susan Gillies, interim general secretary for American Baptist Churches. "We commit ourselves to pray for her as she assumes the responsibilities of office. We look forward to the days and years ahead with great anticipation!"

While IM has a rich history of appointing female missionaries to global service, Koh is the first woman to serve in the position of executive director in the ministry's 202-year history. IM's first single female missionary, Charlotte H. Atlee White Rowe, was appointed in 1815 and served in India from 1816-1826. (See the full story in the spring-2016 issue of On Location.) Other women missionaries have followed in Rowe's footsteps and have made up 60 percent of the 4,000 missionaries appointed by American Baptists.

Koh is the sixth person to hold the title of executive director for this historic mission agency since 1978. Earlier leaders, starting in 1814 with William Staughton, bore the title of corresponding secretary.
