


The CWS Crop Walk sponsored by the Church Women United is a collection of funds by individuals who participate in the walk on the second Sunday in October. Walkers collect donations which are distributed to three local food banks and to the world cause by Church World Service. The three local food banks are at Community Mission, Heart, Love & Soul, and the Salvation Army. Church World Service is the same agency that runs Blanket Sunday and supplies locally made blankets to refugees, those in flood and fire zones, or other areas destroyed by severe storms.

The walk starts at New Hope Baptist on Buffalo Avenue and walkers will walk to the falls and back to the church. It's about 3 miles. Food and beverage will be provided. If you would like to walk, see Donna for a collection envelope.

Our Sunday School continues to flourish and children are studying Scripture, how to pray, and learning the various parts of the service. The baptistery will have its hot water heater soon and we'll schedule baptisms.





THE REVEREND CARMELLA JONES serves in Hungary as a school chaplain through IM partner Hungarian Baptist Aid. Carmella teaches English, acts as a listening presence and offers pastoral care to children and families with special needs.

"I am blessed to serve in a small school teaching English to children with learning disabilities and behavior problems. One morning, I witnessed a second-grader having difficulty concentrating. Initially, I stood beside him to encourage him, but it was clear he was becoming more agitated and he began to cry. When the class ended, he packed his book bag and then kissed me on the cheek! Jesus commands us to care for the least of these. In caring, Jesus pours out living waters not only on the person who is obviously in need, but it is also poured over the care giver and we are all transformed."



THE REV. DR. JON AND AMANDA GOOD serve in partnership with the Baptist Union of Hungary and Hungarian Baptist Aid.

"The Hajnals is one of the families at the Hungarian Talent Elementary School. This night, we shared about a new family English ministry at the school. Upon hearing the news, our friends erupted with excitement. Why start a family English club at an elementary school to share the gospel? While playing games, practicing English, and sharing meals together, the living hope of Jesus abundantly flows. Eighty percent of the families in this public school do not attend church, yet they are thirsty for living water. 

New in the Church Library

The church library of First Baptist Church is more up to date than many church libraries in respect to new thinking and eternal values. This is reflected in recently published resources across the Christian spectrum and the interfaith context of current church missions.

SIDE BY SIDE I personally preach on occasion and sometimes do programs on positive aspects of the Christian role in a multi-faith world. The old notion that we are right and everybody else is wrong seems silly these days, but we have much to offer in Christ and much to learn as led by his Spirit. In case there are any members here who are uncertain about my teachings in this regard, I have put SIDE BY SIDE into the church library to verify the American Baptist Church position, which I support. This little volume is the latest from our ABC publishing house, the Judson Press.



during a renovation a decade ago. First Baptist is not a country church, but many of us have rural roots, and these churches "in the valley by the wildwood" are part of our heritage too. As a spare copy from a sister church, this one is a keeper and a quick and easy read, published by Henry N. Abrams Inc. of NYC,

THE ROOTS OF REFORM This hefty tome covers the early years of the Protestant Reformation, always of interest. Those clamoring for reforms in the church today are, in my opinion, ill-informed about the thorough reformation nearly 500 years ago. After Martin Luther and John Calvin, the next reformers were Baptist, influenced by evangelical Ulrich Zwingli and Anabaptist Simon Menno. Volume II is already in the library, and I happen to have Volume I, so I thought they should be together, a significant set from Fortress Press of the Lutheran Church.

THE RESURRECTION OF HISTORY This is a recent publication from Wipf and Stock Publications and is by an author who frequently attends special events at First Baptist Church. David Bruce served United Church pulpits in Canada for 25 years and was especially known for his adult study series, Jesus 24-7 in four volumes, before being invited by the Roman Catholic Church to come over to them to prepare a Catholic edition of that series. That is still in the works, but *The Resurrection Of History* is opening Catholic eyes and could do the same for some of us.
