


Take several moments the next time you are in the Friendship Room to look over the many portraits in our ever expanding gallery of ministers who have served and/or preached at First Baptist over the years.





Annual Awards Banquet - May 3, 2018




Rev. Dr. Brian A. Brown receives his honoree plaque at the awards ceremony.

Mingling with the well over 300 people from all religions and backgrounds attending the banquet.



ABHMS interim director of Chaplaincy serves as RISE mentor



A relationship with a chaplaincy mentee led the Rev. Dr. Patricia Murphy, American Baptist Home Mission Societies (ABHMS) interim director of Chaplaincy and Specialized Ministries, to official mentorship of 26 Pennsylvania women via the RISE (Renew, Inspire, Support and Empower) Together Mentorship Network, a joint initiative of Union Theological Seminary in New York City and the Women of Color in Ministry (WOCIM) Employment, Mentorship, Advocacy & Education Project. A now-endorsed chaplain whom Murphy was guiding through ABHMS' chaplaincy process recommended Murphy to WOCIM's founder.

"I was just innocently doing what I do all day, every day, and this opportunity was presented," Murphy says. "This [scenario] is the epitome of what RISE is all about. The relationships and the connections make RISE so worthwhile and powerful."

Three mentors in each of eight U.S. regions will collaborate to present a structured curriculum and workshops to their own cohort of women monthly for two years. Serving participants in the Lancaster, Pa., area will be Murphy and two other mentors—the Rev. Dr. Lavette Paige, an adjunct professor of developing leaders at Lancaster Theological Seminary, and Fran Rodriguez, a program officer at Lancaster County Community Foundation.

"Mentoring is a spiritual practice of self-care that calls forth an intrinsic commitment to both personal and vocational growth," says Union's website, quoting the Rev. Dr. Lisa D. Rhodes, RISE Together's executive director and former dean of the chapel at Spelman College, Atlanta. "RISE mentorship is a relational journey of trust and mutual respect with the vision of providing and receiving wisdom for excellence in ministerial leadership."

Murphy points out that RISE is not solely for black women; other women of color participate, too.

RISE helps "women in ministry feel that they have support among their fellow women in ministry—other professionals," she notes. "It helps them to affirm their gifts of ministry. It creates great networking and relationship-building and it helps to further affirm their voice—the voice of women excelling in ministry alongside of men."

ABHMS garners 9 awards from Religion Communicators Council

VALLEY FORGE, PA (ABNS 4/6/18)—At a dinner last night during its 2018 conference in Atlanta, the Religion Communicators Council (RCC) presented American Baptist Home Mission Societies (ABHMS) with nine awards for projects completed in 2017.

"Best of Class" was awarded for the webcast series "6,100 miles, Seven Days: On the Road with ABHMS Disaster Response," for which Susan Gottshall, associate executive director of Communications, documented the sights and sounds encountered as ABHMS Disaster-response Ministries assessed the damage and connected with survivors and first responders on the ground in hurricanes Harvey-, Irma- and Maria-ravaged areas from Louisiana and Texas to Florida and Puerto Rico.

For "Best of Class" awards, one piece of work from each category is judged to be the best of all submissions in that category. In addition to Gottshall, the award recognized each member of the department for their contribution to the project: Joshua Kagi, social media specialist; Danny Ellison, creative designer; Nadine Hasenecz, senior writer/editor; and Sue Peterman, administrative assistant.

Periodicals

In the "E-magazine" category, Curtis Ramsey-Lucas, editor of The Christian Citizen, received an "Award of Merit" for The Christian Citizen online. In the "E-newsletter" category, Gottshall, Ellison, Hasenecz and Kagi garnered an "Award of Excellence" for the "News and Notes" monthly electronic newsletter.

Graphic Design, Art and Photography

In the "Photography, Digital, Series" category, Gottshall received an "Award of Merit" for the series of photographs published with the hurricane damage-assessment travelogue.

Digital Media

In addition to winning "Best of Class," the webcast series "6100 Miles, Seven Days: On the Road with ABHMS Disaster Response" received an "Award of Excellence" that recognized Gottshall, Kagi, Ellison, Hasenecz and Peterman.

Gottshall and Kagi won an "Award of Excellence" for a single webcast interview with Jack Cobb, national relief coordinator for American Baptist Men, who was leading a group of volunteers in post-Hurricane Harvey cleanup in Lake Charles, La. The pair also received an "Award of Merit" for a single webcast interview in which the Rev. Laura Ayala, pastor of First Baptist Church of Rio Piedras, Puerto Rico, spoke of the devastation wrought by Hurricane Maria.

In the "Individual Blog Entry" category, Ramsey-Lucas received an "Award of Excellence" for "Sauntering in Jordan: Finding Peace and Purpose from Amman to Aqaba," while Gottshall garnered an "Award of Merit" for "Pieces of Debris, Pieces of Lives," also about hurricane devastation.

With more than 400 members in professional print and electronic communications, advertising and public relations across the United States, <u>RCC</u> has been promoting faith perspectives in public discourse since 1929.
