

## When You Walk Through a Storm, Hold Your Head Up High

Acorns are the seeds of oak trees, but did you know that acorns which ripen and fall during good weather cannot germinate because their little hats remain on, preventing the insides of the cone from sprouting? The tree can only propagate through a storm in which ripe acorns have their hats off and get scattered across the landscape where the shoots can sprout and find fertile soil.

Many years ago I was coasting along in a fair-weather ministry to a church in western Canada. In my fifth happy year the provincial government decided to dismantle their Expo 86 pavilion at the conclusion of that Vancouver World Exhibition and bring it back to Saskatchewan. They awarded it to the church I was serving, to be reassembled as a community service centre.

On my advice the trustees accepted what amounted to a seventeen-million-dollar gift, designed to look like a glass grain elevator, with twelve stories of program space inside. Church members who opposed the idea began meeting in secret and attempted to convince denominational officials that many people wanted the church to stay exactly as it was, with "enough community service going on here already." They claimed that the congregation had not been sufficiently consulted, and that the Senior Minister was more interested in the community than in the church. I thought I was serving them well, but they wanted me fired.

Heartbroken at their rejection of my ministry, I took leave with my family who shared my distress. Before the denomination decided anything, we left for Nova Scotia to visit my mother. As we neared my old home, we passed the oak tree pictured above, which had obviously just been hit by lightning in a storm. The tree was a perfect picture of how I was feeling, so I took the picture.

It took months of hearings, but the denominational authorities eventually decided that there was nothing in my ministry which could be deemed ineffective. After following the church controversy in the news, the provincial politicians withdrew their offer of the tower. I submitted my resignation, realizing it would be hard to minister to a distressed congregation, and admitting that perhaps the minority had a point. I was leaving much of the pastoral care to associate ministers while I preached to the congregation and worked with the community in radio and TV ministries.

But on behalf of the majority, the trustees of the church unanimously petitioned me to remain and continue my ministry, popular in some quarters. I was grateful for the affirmation, but decided it was time to move on, though I made the effective date of my resignation one year hence. By then I had accepted a call to a wonderful congregation in Ontario, who knew all about my troubles and wanted me anyway. Finishing up in the west, we again took a vacation in Nova Scotia. Near my mother's place, we once again passed that oak tree. Eighteen months later, the field around the tree was now an expansive grove of oak saplings. I took another picture of this miracle.

I continued ministry for years, mostly productive and happy. I have not always remembered my oak tree parable, and not all the spiritual seeds I planted have taken root, but whenever there is a crisis, I walk through the storm with my head held high. I know that God can work miracles, even, and perhaps especially when lightning strikes. As you make your way through Covid-19 and other challenges in life these days, I share my oak tree photos with you. I think you get the picture.



**ELECTION DAY AND VOTING** for the candidate of your choice is an important obligation for citizens in a Democracy. All voters must be registered to vote which can be done in person or by mail at the Board of Elections, DMV, Department of Health and several other locations.

Registrations can be mailed in to the Board of Elections before October 9 and received by the Board of Elections by October 14. On-line applications are available as well at on.ny.gov/3jyU9Pk. Enter your name into the data base to get your mailing place. The application form is available at on.ny.gov/31S4LCY or call 1-800-FOR-VOTE.

Early voting is at (716)438-4040 or (716)438-4041; bit.ly/34R1m9q. Early voting must be done in person so either call one of those numbers or find the Niagara County sites at on.ny.gov/3biGedo. It starts on October 24. There is also Absentee Voting option. Go to the state's absentee ballot portal for a PDF file you have to print at on.gov/3jzY7Hm. Follow directions for mailing in the ballot and don't forget to sign the envelope!

Voting in person on election day, look up the location of your polling place based on your address at on.ny.gov/2Z1Rvdi. Wear a mask and be prepared to wait in line. Many polling places are closed so don't assume your former location is open. Polling places are open from 6:00 AM to 9:00 PM. In Erie County, a postcard will be mailed to you with the location of your polling place.
