
Our external repairs are finished for this season, now we have internal work to do.

### The Christmas Paradox

Around this time of year, the media saturates the airwaves and publications of all sorts with Christmas, ads, stories and imagery, but has difficulty explaining its meaning. Or perhaps the media correctly refrains from attempting to explain the overarching phenomenon of the season. But Christians should know its meaning, so in addition to the celebrations, which themselves are beyond words, we try to get our heads around it, beginning in Advent. The season comes early this year with Advent I (the fourth Sunday before Christmas) falling on November 28 in 2021. So let me be the first to make an in-house attempt to truly understand the good news of Christmas as part of our Advent preparations.

Advent is a preparation for Christmas, which is itself is a paradox: that God can become human. It is like everything else in Christianity that is paradoxical, concluding that death can become life, the theme of Easter. The paradox is that this faith puts the teaching that "the first shall be last, the last shall be first" at its center – like the story of exodus in which the slaves are the favorites of God, or again the crucifixion and the resurrection, that the cross becomes the emblem of triumph over worldly empire.

So beginning with Advent leading to Christmas, our faith ends up becoming the most globally successful way of explaining what our faith is for: turning the upside-down world right side up. Is there anybody whose life has not been turned upside down? Let me assure you from personal experience (the only way to give testimony) that if your life has been turned upside down, you can always get right side up.

So steep yourself in the paradoxical sights and sounds of Christmas, knowing that in Christ, God has come to turn your life right side up, and so that everyone who trusts in Him can live the fullness of life according to God's purpose no matter what challenges we face in the upside-down world.

"Merry Christmas" hardly says it all, but it is a good place to start on Advent I

### **Christmas Joys**



"Joy" is found close to 200 times in the Bible. As Christmas nears, we easily think of Matthew 2:9-10 "And behold, the star that they had seen when it rose went before them until it came to rest over the place where the Child was. When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy." And Luke 2:10 "But the angle said to them, 'Do not be afraid. I bring you Good News that will cause great joy for all the people." We can only imagine the joy experienced by the wise men of old when they saw the brilliant star that led them to the baby Jesus.

So what is joy? It's a gladness of heart. It's dependent on

Jesus rather than on ourselves. It comes from the Holy Spirit. It's the presence of hope. In John 16:22, Jesus said, "So also you have sorrow now, but I will see you again, and your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy from you." Biblical joy is knowing Jesus and being filled to overflowing with the need to rejoice. It's having faith in God's Word, in God's promises.

Any happiness or joy that we create for ourselves is temporary. The joy we receive through Jesus Christ is permanent. To find Christ's permanent joy, we need to set aside time to rejoice, to celebrate, to give praise for what God promises us!

We experience joy when we see God's creation all around us. We know true joy when we acknowledge the blessings that we've received through the presence of our children, our family and our friends. And we share that joy by introducing others to our Savior, to that innocent Babe in the manger, to that God Man who hung from the cross for our sins. Our joy is doubled when those we love also love Jesus. 1 Peter 1:8-9 says, "Although you have not seen Him, you love Him; and even though you do not see Him now, you believe in Him and rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy, for you are receiving the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls."

We strengthen our joy when we share it, when we become like that star that guided the magi to the Baby Jesus. "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children are walking in the truth." 3 John 1:4. We strengthen our joy when we spend time with God – in God's presence we experience true joy. Psalm 16:11 – "You make known to me the path of life; in Your presence there is fullness of joy; at Your right hand are pleasures forevermore." Proverbs 12:20 says that "those who promote peace have joy." We strengthen our joy when we abide in Jesus' love. John 15:10-12 tells us, "If you keep My commandments, you will abide in My love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in His love. I have said these things to you so that My joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete. This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you."

This Christmas season we are especially called to share the joy that we know, to let others know that they are loved, they are important, that God is calling to them, guiding them, wants to comfort them. It's probably the most important gift that we can give anyone – the joy that they are loved, the joy that they are not alone. We are to "rejoice in the Lord always" (Philippians 4:4), knowing that God freely offers the gift of salvation to everyone. If we could put it in a box, wrap it with beautiful paper, add a bow



and ribbons and present it to everyone ... what a wondrous gift, what a gift filled with in-imaginable joy! Wishing you all the most blessed and peaceful, joy-filled Christmas!

# PROJECT SPOTLIGHT


## Haiti — Clean Water Project



**GOAL** The goal of this project is to provide safe, clean water for thousands of families in Haiti.


**SUMMARY** This project seeks to raise \$66,360 to provide 14 villages in Haiti with water pumps to prevent the spread of waterborne illnesses like cholera, dengue fever and chikungunya.

**DESCRIPTION** Since the 2010 earthquake in Haiti, there have been cholera epidemics and outbreaks of dengue fever and chikungunya. People rely on dirty river water they share with cows and other livestock. The people of Haiti need access to safe, clean water. Digging to reach clean water is expensive—nearly \$2,000 per well, which is far beyond the reach of Haitians who earn \$1 a day. There are additional costs, including moving the drilling equipment to a village, installing casing and pipes and flushing and cleaning the system. Having clean, safe water for drinking, cooking and washing will reduce the spread of waterborne illnesses so people can go to school and work to provide for their families. This project will be managed by IM missionary Nzunga Mabudiga. It is anticipated that this project will not only provide water that is safe for drinking, cooking and washing, but also promote health and improve the economic status of the villagers.


