



THe PLay

I would like to start by both congratulating and thanking the congregation for hosting and producing the play, *Three Testaments: Shalom, Peace, Salam* in June. One of my colleagues exclaimed, "So that is what a Scholar-in-Residence does ... where can I find such a congregation?"

Together we succeeded in engaging the community, including some from Buffalo to Toronto, but definitely closer to home for the most part. This included local Jews, local Muslims and local Christians, both those wishing their churches could mount such a relevant show, and other Christians who have given up on churches that have little idea or interest in what is going on in the world.

The impact of this play on Niagara Falls, NY, may take years to appreciate, and we hope to undertake more such ventures meanwhile, but as one drives around and notices the empty and inactive church structures which dot the landscape in these times, First Baptist has served notice that we are here and we know what is going on. A visiting couple the other week said as much.

In detail, we broke even financially, with generous assistance from Jewish, Muslim and Christian supporters in the USA and Canada who appreciated what we were doing. We had dreamed of 1,000 in attendance, but that was too optimistic. There were a couple nights in which there were over a hundred patrons in the house, but usually 30 to 50 per evening with even fewer patrons once during the ten nights, and always another 20 – 25 present as actors and behind the scenes personnel. Maybe the attendance was 1,000 after all if we count those who saw the play time and again.

We also cleared over \$300.00 for the Inasmuch circle, and almost another \$300.00 from the play patrons alone for the One Great Hour of Sharing, but this event was not intended to be a fund raiser as much as a consciousness raiser, for the community to become more conscious of the leadership role of First Baptist, and for our own members to become more aware of the spiritual dynamics of the confused and troubled times in which we minister. Special thanks and congratulations to nearly two dozen of our own members who served in large and small ways in this undertaking.

Nearly 10,000 Households in Nepal Receive Aid from IM Partner

The first earthquake hit Nepal on April 25, 2015. Within days, American Baptist International Ministries (IM) had reached out to help with the first phase of relief efforts—emergency care and supplies—with funds from the American Baptist Churches' One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) offering. This aid was sent to IM's partners in Nepal, including United Mission to Nepal (UMN).

As of June 8, UMN had provided relief to 9,980 households, including many in the hardest-hit and most difficult-to-reach areas. In this <u>three-minute video</u>, see how UMN brought hope to a remote and impoverished village that had been devastated by the earthquake.
