

OCTOBER HIGHLIGHTS included a successful Rummage and Chowder Sale and an International Second Sunday lunch. We thank the rummagers, Cheryl Taylor, Connie Davis, Hazel Baxter, Marge Bozigar and Donna Flood for arranging, selling, and cleaning up our sale which netted \$250. We appreciate all the donations for our community event. We even had guests from Idaho! Our second event was the International Potluck luncheon on our second Sunday. The favorite recipes from family favorites from Pakistan, Ireland, and the southern United States provided varied tastes.

The Crop Walk collection netted \$165 from our congregation. Other congregations from Niagara Falls participated for a total of \$800 for food. The 25% that is returned to our community goes to Heart, Love, & Soul, Community Missions, and the Salvation Army. The remainder provides food around the world through CWS.

In November, the Candy makers gather to make the delicious butter walnut crunch candy which is our big fall fund raising effort. The plan is to make candy for five mornings this month to have the taste of Christmas ready for next month. Election Day is November 5. Plan to vote your conscience and pick the new mayor of Niagara Falls and other important officials locally and across the state. Our bakers will be holding the Bake Sale at Niagara Frontier Fire Hall from 7 AM to sell out at that election site. If you'd like to help, contact Donna through the church office. Transportation will be provided.

Community Missions is an important charity focus for Thanksgiving. If you'd like to donate food items for holiday celebrations for the less fortunate, bring in your shelf stable items during the month. They will be distributed to the needy.

November is also pledge month. Pledging your financial support is very important for the financial wellbeing of our church and its upkeep and outreach programs. The 2020 Budget will be prepared after the pledges come in. Time and talent are also most valued and are necessary. Many hands make light work when it comes to getting work done and First Baptist has a tradition of doers and donors.

David & Joyce Reed now serving as IM's Global Coordinators of Spiritual Care



<u>David and Joyce Reed</u> have been reassigned to serve as IM's *Global Coordinators\* for Spiritual Care*. In this role, they will broaden and expand work they have done as Regional Consultants for Spiritual Care in Iberoamerica and the Caribbean to focus on cultivating a culture of health and wellbeing for IM personnel around the globe, as well as in the home office in King of Prussia, PA. They will collaborate with IM leadership and area directors to coordinate implementation of Goals for Personnel Care set forth in IM's strategic plan *Responding to the Call*.

David and Joyce served for 16 years as IM missionaries in La Paz, Mexico and have served 4 years in their regional role facilitating spiritual care for global servants. Joyce is currently a doctoral student at Portland Seminary focusing on spiritual formation and leadership in her ministry context with global servants. She and David teach in the Masters of Theological Studies in Latino/a Ministries which is a joint venture of IM, Palmer Theological Seminary, and the American Baptist Home Mission Societies. In recent years, they have integrated spiritual care practices more deeply into IM's annual Conference for Missionaries and Hear the Call Retreats.

Their aim as spiritual caregivers is ...

- to offer spiritual guidance, support, and presence
- to provide workshops and retreats on self-care, soul care, and community care practices
- to research and find resources to support spiritual growth and health;
- to walk with colleagues through significant times of transition, transformation, grief and loss
- to mentor global servants during their first years on the field.

"This new assignment carries forward IM's historical commitment to care for its global servants," says Jim Bell. "Care for Personnel' is a high value for IM. As global coordinators for spiritual care, David and Joyce will allow IM to more intentionally cultivate a culture of health and member care which sustains and nurtures global servants and staff so that they may thrive and be effective in following God's call to global service."



# The Kingdom of God is a Party

Since the death of Billy Graham, many people would say that the most recognized and admired Baptist preacher in America is Tony Campolo, and he happens to be affiliated with the American Baptist Church, just like us. We had the good fortune to have Campolo as the guest speaker at the 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary dinner of this congregation the year before last.

He preaches and teaches from his position as professor of sociology at Eastern College, a Baptist seminary in St. David's, Pennsylvania. Books like *Who Switched the Price Tags* and *Hot Potatoes Christians are Afraid to Touch* emphasize his attitude about worship where we are to "rejoice" and "celebrate" and sing Hallelujah as if we mean it.



My favourite book by my friend Tony is called *The Kingdom of God is a Party*. Things around this church are pretty lively and even joyful. People are even getting used to the idea of laughing in church when one of the ministers tells a joke ... always with a point related to the sermon. I put a copy of Tony Campolo's book about happiness into the church library, relating our beliefs to a positive outlook in church life and beyond. I invite you to pick up this good read and enjoy it: *The Kingdom of God is a Party*.
