Celebrating

American Baptists respond to Washington state landslide

In response to the March 22 landslide in Oso, Wash., American Baptist Churches USA has released through ABHMS an initial \$2,500 One Great Hour of Sharing Emergency Disaster Response Grant to First Baptist Church (FBC), Darrington, Wash.

The landslide resulted in injury, death and missing persons. FBC held a community prayer service and has been



supplying food to displaced families. The grant will help with expenses associated with transportation, funerals, utilities and emergency services.

"The road to Darrington has been cut off. To get to work, many drivers must now take a three-hour round trip. With the high price of gas, we are trying to collect funds to help people get to work and back home," says Michael De Luca, FBC's pastor. "Another area of concern is for the many funerals that will be taking place in the near future."




