Humor and the church—Those who drop by the study, will note that on the door is a poster board on which I place several comics. The poster board is called "Godly Humor". And do I have a favorite? Pickles, written and drawn by a person all of 65. Then, of course, there is Zits who reminds me of our three teen age grandsons.

What place does humor have in the life of the church? I would like to quote from an article which appears in the monthly publication: "The Joyful Noiseletter". It was written by a MS Betty C. Hatcher, the editor of the church newsletter called: "Calvin Calling'. The title of the article is "Did the disciples laugh? Did they ever have fun? Those solemn scribes who wrote down the Gospels in the New Testament left out something. I'm wondering did the Disciples laugh.

It was 12 mostly young men who walked with Jesus down those dust roads together. I cannot believe that they walked with solemn strides, heads down, arms folded and lips pursed. These disciples were like interns learning about the holy task for which they were chosen. All but two were eventually martyred. But they were still young those first three years with Jesus. Did someone slip a small frog under Andrews beard when he overslept? Did they snatch the moneybag and play keep-away, tossing it around while Judas grabbed furiously at it? Did Jesus himself grin, changing their wine back to water? (I have at home, a drawing of a laughing Jesus. Rather nice). Did they play hide-and-seek in the woods?

The Bible clearly says we are made in the image of God. Seeing some of God's creations, I'm sure the laughter we are born with is His also. I can relate to them and see the disciples more clearly, more human, if I know they laughed. It I make it to Heaven, I'll ask them: "What happened that was funny when you were with Jesus and did all of you laugh?"
