### From Pastor Wes Bourdette: "WHO'S PREACHING"

Before going to worship, before entering the sanctuary, Protestants often ask, "Who's preaching?" If we hear the "wrong" answer, we express disappointment and may say so. "Why didn't the pastor tell us that he/she wouldn't be preaching today? If I'd known, I would have stayed home."

Is it possible for us to contrast our usual Protestant approach to worship with the Roman Catholic approach? For the Roman Catholic, the preacher/priest takes second-fiddle to the Sacrament of the Supper. Our Protestant tradition places a heavy, non-biblical burden on the pastor to "perform", and to perform well.

With the potpourri of Protestant pulpit presenters in any given community, we may, indeed focus our participation, response, and commitment on a pastor – personality and pulpit presence, rather than on the risen Christ and His word. If we do, then we will begin to make value judgments about what and how the pastor preaches, instead of listening to God's word to us. From this process comes the "I like it, I don't like it" syndrome. We stay around so long as the pastor agrees with us; we leave when she/he doesn't

No we may not resign, or join another church. We, may however, slowly or quickly, withdraw our presence, money or support. When we withdraw or withhold long enough, the session or governing body puts us on the inactive roll. Then, we get angry and tell others that the church kicked us out. And so it goes.

One must ask one's self, not (1) "What's in it for me?" but (2) "God, what do you want me to do in, through, and beyond this worship hour? How will I respond as your servant in my home, vocation, school, recreation, community, world? Here am I, use me, send me!"

So, the question, "Who's preaching? At best is irrelevant. The better question is this: "Am I present? Am I ready for a God-event? Am I open to the voice and will of God – to be led by the Presence and Power of the living Christ – today, and from now on?"
