
I got to Colgate Rochester Crozer Divinity





It's really more important than we think. It is a real service we do in our community. Heart, Love & Soul provides greatly needed services to residents of the north side of Niagara Falls on a regular and ongoing basis. It's not just a "soup kitchen."

Perhaps you have seen Sr. Beth Brosmer on TV in the recent M & T Bank commercials. First Baptist Church each month provides items – such as personal items – that Heart, Love & Soul does not get through food banks.

Dear Friends at First Baptist Church,

Where has the summer gone? As the children begin another school year, many of them take with them fond memories of summer fun and learning provided by Heart & Soul, here or elsewhere. Heading into autumn, we gratefully acknowledge your recent contribution of 48 lbs. of food which we received on September 2, 2014. Without the support of donors like you, much of what we do would not be possible.

For the past year we have been using a new, innovative system in our food pantry. Now, instead of preparing bags of food for our clients, they shop for themselves for fruits, vegetable, grains and proteins, according to the number of people in the family. Our "shoppers" are more than satisfied with this arrangement. Last month 553 families (979 individuals) received nourishing food from our pantry. We are still serving nutritious breakfasts and hot lunches for approximately 180 persons per day.

Our nurse Barbara Malinowski retired after 10 years at Heart & Soul and now Sister Mary Kay Tyrell, a Sister of Charity from Mt. St. Mary's Hospital, has assumed those duties. Our Social Worker Janet Smith is also kept busy meeting various needs of our guests.

We are grateful for all the blessings of this past summer...that we were able provide meaningful recreation for so many children, that we had plenty of food, especially fresh produce from area farmers and gardeners to feed our guests in the dining room and in the pantry. And we are thankful to you for being a part of our family of generous givers.




Bible Study

Reading "Our" Play at Trinity College, Dublin


First Baptist scholar-in-residence **Dr. Brian Arthur Brown** and his wife Jenny toured England this summer, as Brian presented a lecture on his main book, *Three Testaments: Torah, Gospel and Quran* at Oxford University.

Colleagues also presented the *Three Testaments Companion* to students at the Cambridge Interfaith Summer School, while Dr. Brown held meetings at the British Museum and British Library, researching material for his forthcoming book, Four *Testaments: Tao te Ching, Analects, Dhammapada, Bhagavad Gita*.

These writings offer Christians an opportunity to understand the complex world in which we live in the twenty-first century, and puts forward the Gospel of Jesus Christ in a manner which may be appreciated by others in a world which is sometimes suspicious of Christian business, political and military activities around the globe.

Following the time in England, the Brown's went on to Ireland, where Dr. Brown's play, *Three Testaments: Shalom, Peace, Salam* was reviewed by academics prior to its use in class at St. Patrick's Seminary (Roman Catholic) and Trinity College (Anglican) in Dublin, pictured below.

First read at our church last autumn, the play is now scheduled to open at the West End Theatre in New York City on June 10, 2015. New bird masks have been created by Jeanette Heasley of our congregation, and the play may someday have its upstate New York premiere right here.
